Brains and Bellies - What's the Connection?

"Beloved, I hope you are prospering in every respect and are in good health, just as your soul is prospering." ~ 3 John 1:2

"If you've ever 'gone with your gut' to make a decision or felt 'butterflies in your stomach' when nervous, you're likely getting signals from an unexpected source: your second brain. Hidden in the walls of the digestive system, this 'brain in your gut' is revolutionizing medicine's understanding of the links between digestion, mood, health and even the way you think." - Johns Hopkins Medicine

The link between the brain and the gut is undeniable, and we are learning more all the time. It can be safely stated, with what we know now, that caring for your gut health is of utmost importance if you want your brain (processing information, concentrating, sequencing, remembering, mood) at top functioning levels. Johns Hopkins recommends 5 ways to support gut health:

- 1) Eat the right foods! You may wonder what the best "diet" is for best brain/belly health and most doctors would agree: The Mediterranean Diet. A new study shows that older people who followed a Mediterranean diet retained more brain volume over a three-year period than those who did not follow the diet as closely. The study is published in the January 4, 2017, online issue of Neurology®, the medical journal of the American Academy of Neurology. Need a quick reference guide? Check this out: Some "Yes" foods include: vegetables, fruits, whole grains, nuts, seeds, fish, olive oil. Some "No" (or greatly limited) foods include: red meat, white bread, white pasta, pastries, sodas, candy, deli meats, hot dogs.*Check with your physician prior to making serious diet changes.
- **2) Get more sleep!** Not getting enough sleep is linked to a higher prevalence of obesity, which sets you up for digestive system disorders.
- **3) Move more.** As with other aspects of health, exercise is the best way to lose weight and maintain a healthy body weight to ward off digestive system problems.
- 4) Manage stress. Reducing stress is fundamental to reducing heartburn.
- **5) Get help for issues like anxiety and depression.** Mood and digestive system health (especially disorders like irritable bowel syndrome) are closely linked via the brain-gut connection.
