Palm Sunday

Due to the pandemic guidelines, our distribution of Palms for our Palm Sunday liturgies has been modified slightly to ensure they are safely distributed. This year there will be no procession from outside into the church. Palms will be handed out by the Greeters wearing gloves as each person enters the church for Mass. The palms will have been blessed prior to the Mass. We have reduced the number of palms purchased this year, so extra palms will be available only after the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday.





Strokes - What to Know

"For I know well the plans I have in mind for you...plans for your welfare and not for woe, so as to give you a future of hope." ~ Jeremiah 29:11

What is a stroke? A stroke is a sudden interruption of the blood supply in the brain, usually in the form of a blocked artery or when a blood vessel bursts.

How can I help prevent a stroke?

- Healthy diet! Eating fresh fruits, vegetables, foods low in trans fats, saturated fats and cholesterol, foods high in fiber, limit salt.
- Maintain a healthy weight!
- Adults: 2 hours and 30 minutes of moderate physical exercise weekly, at least! (Consult your physician for your individual plan).
- No smoking, of course.
- If you drink alcohol, drink in moderation. The CDC recommends no more than two drinks per day for men and no more than one drink per day for women.

What increases my chances of having a stroke?

- High blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, heart disease, smoking.

What are the warning signs of a stroke?

- Sudden **numbness** or weakness in the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body.
- Sudden **confusion**, trouble speaking, or difficulty understanding speech.
- Sudden **trouble seeing** in one or both eyes.
- Sudden **trouble walking**, dizziness, loss of balance, or lack of coordination.
- Sudden **severe headache** with no known cause.

The quick test if you suspect a stroke: F.A.S.T.

Face: Ask the person to smile. Is there a droop on either side of the smile?

Arms: Ask the person to raise both arms to touch their hands over their head. Are they able to do this?

Speech: Ask the person to repeat a word, such as "buttercup" three times. Do you notice anything strange with their speech?

Time: Are any of these symptoms present? Time to call 911!!
