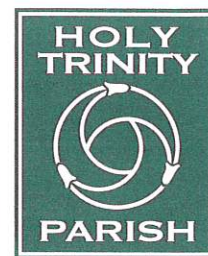

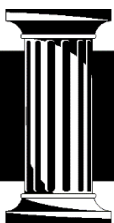

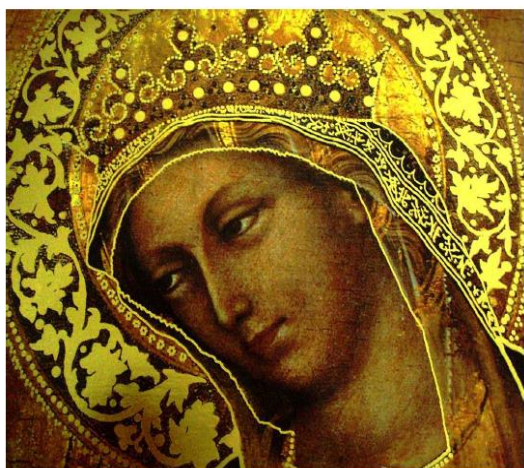

Dear Parishioners,

In January 2019, we embarked on the *One Parish Family* Capital Campaign, an ambitious endeavor to address the needs of our Holy Trinity Parish community. The three-tiered campaign goals include paying off our debt (\$1.8 million), repairing our campus (\$1.2 million), and establishing a maintenance reserve fund (\$500,000).

Retiring the debt and establishing a maintenance reserve free-up financial gifts so that we can maximize funding for programs and ministries that enhance the faith and mission of our parish.

Repairs to the Social Center and Education Center roofs have been completed. Repairs to the church's Baptistery, Quiet room and View room are in process. Long term weather damage to the Bell Tower and Narthex will begin to be repaired in Spring 2022.

In March 2020, our world became dark. Between the Corona virus and wildfires these past 18 months have been difficult. We have experienced the loss of loved ones, employment, and other hardships. Yet, throughout it all, you have shown great faith and love as one parish family. Holy Trinity's outreach to those in need, as seen during the Caldor Fire, is indeed an outpouring of God's love to our neighbors.


As a parish family, we have donated over \$15,000 in food, money, and other donations to Caldor Fire evacuees. While these are loving acts we can count, I am confident there are many more that are immeasurable, made without recognition. May God bless each of you for your quiet sacrifices.

While reaching out to others, you have continued to honor your pledge commitments to the *One Parish Family* Capital Campaign. Because of your generosity, we have paid off approximately 85% of our debt, repaired the Social and Education Centers' roofs, and, as you can see by the scaffolding, we will soon have new windows on the south side of our church. Praise God!

I come to you in thanksgiving for your faithfulness, and to ask those who are able, to help me finish the race we began with the *One Parish Family* Capital Campaign. The current repairs to the south side of the church are \$200,000. We anticipate beginning repairs to the bell tower next spring at an estimated cost of \$850,000. With pledge payments of \$1.78 million paid to date, we are well on our way to paying off debt and repairing our church.

In the days ahead, we will be reaching out to you about the status of your gift or pledge and invite those who can, to step forward. We are truly blessed to serve as *"the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden."* (Matthew 5:14)

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

Because of your commitment to the *One Parish Family* Capital Campaign, Holy Trinity's financial position has improved dramatically:

- Pledged \$2.77 million - 92% - of our \$3.0 million goal to address parish debt and financial obligations and critical repairs and maintenance of our facilities.
- Paid \$1.67 million of those 3-year pledges, allowing us to
 - o Repair the roofs on the Social and Education Centers
 - o Pay-off the diocesan debt of \$413,000
 - o Paid-down the debt on the Social and Education Centers by \$881,136 – a 95 percent reduction!
- Begin repairs to the Baptistry, Quietng Room and View Room areas with estimated cost of \$200,000.
 - Schedule repairs to the bell tower and narthex for the spring of 2022.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP –

Last year, due to the pandemic, our total debt as a parish increased to \$2.7 million.

*Because of your generosity over the past 15 months, our debt as of 9/1/21
has been reduced by \$2.4 million and is now only \$275,000.*

- We are still missing Sponsor Forms, Certificate Forms and Service Logs from a few candidates. Please turn them in to the Faith Formation Office as soon as possible.

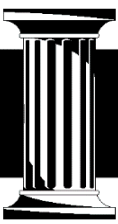

September 2021 Thank You and a Plea for Help

A flyer was sent out in April regarding Kevin Kimario's illnesses and need for prayers and money to help with his treatments. As a result of our petition, it is with sincere gratitude that we give thanks for your prayers and financial support, and the continuing support from Holy Trinity Parish which have helped bring Kevin through the intense first stage of treatment.

Kevin has been in need of medical intervention since Dec. 2020. He was diagnosed with stage 4 colon cancer, including a number of secondary illnesses as well. With the success of the first stage of treatment, the secondary illnesses have been addressed. We are currently focusing on the treatment of this now stage 2 colorectal cancer. The oncologist said people rarely recover from stage 4. Kevin is improving but very weak at this point. The doctors feel that it is necessary that he have the colorectal surgery as soon as possible. In order to prepare for his surgery, scheduled for Monday, September 13, the doctors have been focused on building up Kevin's physical and immune strength.

Needless to say our financial resources have been depleted and we will need help with this upcoming surgery and all that it entails. There is no health insurance, but we have been able to enroll him in a new cancer treatment program, with many benefits. After Kevin heals from this surgery, he will need one last treatment – chemotherapy. The surgery and hospital stay, medications, special food and supplements, will be close to \$6000.

Kevin receives pain medication every two days as his pain is excruciating.
Cost: \$300 a month.



Our dear Kevin is 24 yrs. old, married with a young wife and 9 mo. old baby girl. Kevin was an orphan. His father died before he was born and his mother died shortly after. Kevin told me, "I'm doing all I can to live because my daughter needs a dad and I want to be there for her and give her all the love I have received from my adopted parents, Joe and Julianne." Kevin was 4 years old when we brought him into our family. We are trying to help him realize his dream.

We realize Holy Trinity parishioners have been most generous regarding our orphans. However, at this time we need special help for Kevin. Financial support can be sent to:

This Fund was established as a non-profit fund in May 2021 and approved by the California Secretary of State. The IRS has assigned EIN 86-3809544 to the Fund and on July 5, 2021 we applied to the IRS for registration as a tax-exempt entity. Due to the pandemic, there is a significant delay in IRS review and approval of applications. However, we anticipate our request will be granted based on the California approval. IRS regulations state that approval of tax exempt status is retroactive to the date the Fund was formed, which was May 20, 2021.



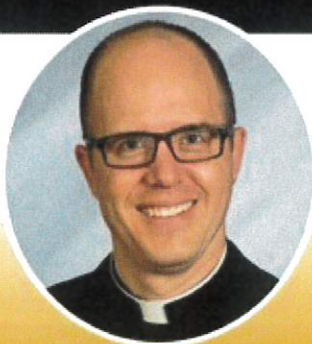
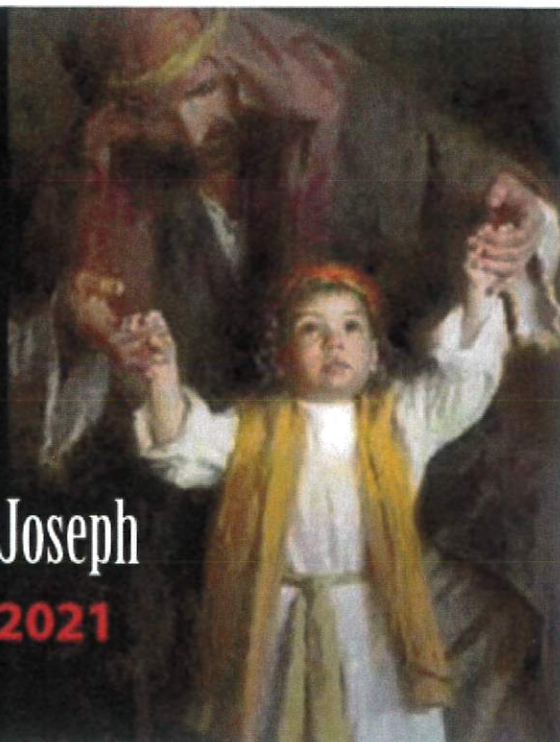

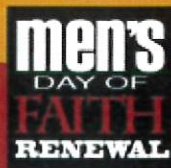
